## **Course Information**

Representative instructor syllabus and accompanying documents must provide:

- 1. Course details including department coding, course title and credit hours
- 2. Course description
- 3. Course Prerequisites
- 4. Delivery Modes
- 5. Text Books, Learning Resources, and Readings
- 6. Student learning outcomes
- 7. Detailed Description of assignments, writing assignments, projects
- 8. Methods of evaluation of student learning directly linked to course objectives and outcomes
- 9. Grading criteria and scale
- 10. Detailed Topical outline and weekly schedule. In general, this should go beyond chapter numbers and titles.
- 11. All materials submitted for panel review must be recent and representative.

Prerequisites

• If prerequisites are required; they must be of appropriate level, from an appropriate discipline, should logically precede the proposed course, and is essential to students' preparation.

Delivery Mode

• Traditional, Online, Tele-course or other

Textbooks, Learning Resources, or Readings

• The choice of required text or readings should reflect the course content and focus. As institutions pursue the opportunity to expand into online/open resource electronic text material, the panel has sought to provide some necessary guidance on citing these resources in submitted syllabi and documents. Student Outcomes

• Provide additional evidence that the course focus is aligned with the IAI course descriptor.

Assignments

• Assignments should reflect evidence of the student learning outcomes.

Evaluation

- Method of student evaluation must be linked to course objectives and student outcomes.
- Distribution of grading categories will provide evidence of course rigor.

Detailed Topical Outline/Weekly Schedule

• The committee will review the schedule for evidence of the content focus of the course. This outline should go beyond chapter numbers and titles.

Discipline Specific Concerns

• General Coding Practice A course can only be assigned to one code/description. However, multiple courses from the same institution may be assigned the same code/description.

Common Reasons Courses Are Not Approved

- Course does not match description for IAI designation and/or course objectives do not match the IAI designation
- Course has inappropriate prerequisites Please see section on prerequisites above.
- Assignments fail to provide students the expected learning mastery of the topics and learning objectives.
